

About the Artistic Director

Diane VanDerhei is an accomplished dancer, educator and choreographer whose credentials include developing and implementing comprehensive K-12 dance curriculum for the Minneapolis, Milwaukee and Chicago school systems. She graduated from the National Academy of Dance in Champaign, Illinois, a high school exclusively devoted to dance education where she studied classical ballet with Lupe Serrano and Gwynne Ashton and jazz with Buzz Miller.

After graduation, she performed and toured nationally with the National Ballet of Illinois, the Ballet Folk of Moscow and Wild Space Dance Company. She earned a B.F.A. in dance and dance education from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and holds state certification to teach K4- 12 grades dance. She has choreographed numerous acclaimed works and was the recipient of the first Milwaukee County Fellowship in Choreography. From 2003-2008, Diane served as a teaching artist and education consultant for Hubbard Street Dance Chicago's Education and Community Programs. Ms. VanDerhei is a founding board member of the Illinois Dance Education Organization and is the Chair for the Illinois representation of the National Honor Society for Dance Arts. Besides her work at INTUIT Dance, she works at Irving School in Oak Park, and teaches students with disabilities. She grew up in Green Bay, WI a mile from Lambeau Field during the 1960's.

Connor Cornelius (she/her) is a choreographer, performer, and teaching artist based in the Chicagoland area. She has taught at Intuit Dance, the Illinois High School State Dance Festival and master classes in the area. Musicals include: Mamma Mia, Sister Act, Working, Newsies, Chicago, Hairspray, Addams Family, Mean Girls and Mary Poppins at OPRFHS. Choreography highlights include physically-integrated pieces for Chicago Live! and See Chicago Dance for MOMENTA Dance Company. Under the name GRIT and the umbrella of ChoreoSpace, she produced several full evening length works and choreographed the Illinois All-State Theatre Festival musical, Shrek. Kaillin Flynn Joodwin


